Matt Sayman



Coach Matt Sayman is currently completing his first year as the head basketball coach at Midway High School and his 19th year overall in coaching. Prior to arriving at Midway, Sayman spent 12 years as the head coach at Grapevine Faith Christian School, where his teams reached the state Final Four twice and became known for their offensive firepower, averaging 365 made three-pointers per season.

Sayman began his coaching career as a varsity assistant, spending one year working for Jeff Clarkson at Naaman Forest High School and five years under Wes Watson at McKinney High School.

Matt and his wife Jana, a teacher at Midway, have two children. Their oldest son, Landon, plays college basketball at Trinity University, and their youngest, Cade, is a senior in high school who plays soccer.

TABC has had a significant impact on Coach Sayman's career as both a player and a coach. He played for Coach Tommy Thomas at The Colony High School and was selected to compete in the TABC All-Star Game as a senior. He went on to play collegiately at Baylor University from 2000–2004.

Texas High School Basketball Hall of Fame Nominations

Nominations for the Texas High School Basketball Hall of Fame are always being accepted. Below is some information on how candidates are considered and how you can nominate someone.

CATEGORIES: Coach, Player, Contributor

REQUIREMENTS TO BE CONSIDERED:

- Active coaches may be considered after reaching 900 wins.
- Retired coaches may be considered at any time based on accomplishments.
- Texas high school players may be considered fifteen years after graduation from high school.
- Contributors may be considered at any time.

1. Name of Nominee
2. Years (ex. 1966-1969) /Records/School(s)
3. Honors, Stats, Newspaper Articles, Letters of Recommendation
4. Name/Contact Information of the Person Making the Nomination

All nominations will be forwarded to the Texas High School Basketball Hall of Fame Selection Committee.

Nomination and Registration Deadlines

The deadlines for nominating your players, coaches and student assistants are coming up soon, so don't miss out on getting them the recognition they deserve. Below is a list of awards along with their nomination deadlines.

Academic All-State (Still Open)) Open to Senior players and managers who earned a varsity letter and have a minimum seven-semester cumulative average of 92 on a 100-point scale or minimum of 3.7 on a 4-point scale.

Free Throw and 3 Point Awards (March 21) Click the link for 3 Point – FT and enter the stats. **All winners will be taken from these nominations so it is not necessary to e-mail TABC with your stats.** Please wait until your season is over to submit your nominations and please only submit them one time. Only shots made in games against VARSITY teams will count.

Scholarships: (April 1) TABC awards 24 high school scholarships annually. Be sure to check the boxes for all scholarships for which the player is eligible.

TABC Clinic Pre-Registration: (April 24) You can avoid long lines at check in and save \$10 by pre-registering for the TABC Clinic. Registration forms and complete payment must be received by the TABC office by April 24.

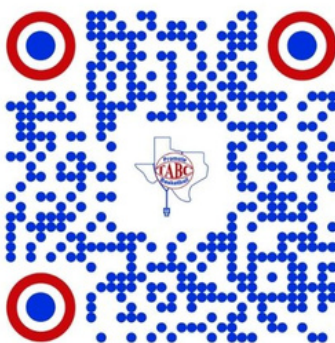

Summer Sodek of Flatonia (28-2A) girls just completed her stellar high school career being named all state for the fourth season. During that time, she scored 3,461 points, including 333 three-point shots at 36% and 600 free throws at 78%. In addition, she had 1,236 rebounds, 651 steals and 736 assists. The varsity team record for her career was 122-21. She will play next season for Coach Beth Jillison at Texas Women's University in Denton. Bethany McLeod is her coach and her father is the Flatonia Superintendent and former TABC board member Chris Sodek.

During the 2025-26 season there were two UIL schools whose boys and girls were both state champions. Panhandle (Rob Shmucker and Josh Strickland) and Lipan (Amber Branson and Brent Gaylor) achieved the rare feat. Austin Westlake (Vickie Benson and Robert Lucero) had both girls and boys make the championship final.

The TABC weekly rankings get basketball fans' competitive juices flowing and the various rankings committees do a great job but we are not perfect. Our apologies to the teams and fans from the Panhandle boys (Josh Strickland) and the Hitchcock girls (Sam Richardson). Both were state champions and were never ranked this season.

The following boys' teams made their first appearance in the state tournament in 2026: Little Elm (Damon Bennett), Fort Bend Crawford (Chris Iles), Palestine Westwood (Kadrian Bryant), Orangefield (Bryan Whitmire) and Panhandle (Josh Strickland). On the girls' side Leander Glenn (Katina Fournoy-Walker) and Hitchcock (Sam Richardson) were first timers. Fort Bend Crawford opened in 2023, so they made the Big Show in their third year of existence.

Senior Jace Sullivan of Tom Bean High School finished the season averaging 30.4 points per game. He scored forty points in seven games and finished his career with over 2,100 points. Jace played for his dad, TABC board member JD Sullivan, at Ponder, MP Chapel Hill and Tom Bean where the varsity teams won 127 games during the past four years.

At the UIL state tournaments the following schools in this year's field have made the most appearances since the tournament began: Lipan boys (17) and Dallas Kimball boys (16), Martins Mill girls (20) and Dallas Lincoln girls (18). Nazareth girls are the leader for this year with 33 appearances. The Swiftettes have won an amazing 27 titles.

Waco Live Oak Classical won both the boys and girls TAPPS 3A state championships in Waco February 27-28. For the girls of Coach Steven Howard it was back to back titles. The boys coach is Kyle Combs. With a hometown crowd the Falcons and Lady Falcons won the ultimate prize.

At the conclusion of the recent UIL girls and boys state tournaments in San Antonio, no one was more excited than former Waxahachie boys coach and TABC past president Lonnie Gaylor and his wife Myra. Two of their grandchildren play for Lipan which won both the girls and the boys state championships. Sydni Gaylor (freshman) plays for the girls and Court Gaylor plays for the boys. In addition, both were named MVP of their respective championship game. To our knowledge this is unprecedented for a brother/sister to be selected for that honor in the same year. Their dad is Brent Gaylor who coaches the boys and Amber Branson is the girl's coach.

Edinburg Harvest Christian won the girls 1A state championship for the fourth consecutive year. The Lady Eagles are coached by Jaime Gonzalez. He coached all four of those champions.

John Wooden Legacy Award 2025-26

The National Association of Basketball Coaches recognizes one outstanding boys' basketball coach and one outstanding girls' basketball coach in all fifty states and Washington DC with the John Wooden Legacy Award. The criteria for this award are rooted in the ideals of Education, Longevity, Character, Service and Excellence. The winners from the state of Texas are Kit Kyle Martin from Carthage High School and Tommy Brakel from North Crowley High School. Congratulations to both. See their bios below:

Kit Kyle Martin



Coach Kit Kyle Martin is currently serving as the Athletic Coordinator and Head Girls Basketball Coach at Carthage High School and is in her 30th year of coaching and education. She has compiled a varsity record of 783–218. Her teams have qualified for the playoffs 25 times, won 19 District Championships, advanced to 12 Regional Tournaments, captured five regional championships, and made five appearances in the UIL State Tournament, including three Final's appearances.

She has coached at Marcus HS, Barbers Hill HS, Mansfield Timberview HS, and just completed her first year at Carthage HS. She has over 50 student athletes to go on and compete for D-1 college basketball programs. Coach Martin has been recognized with numerous honors, including Dallas Morning News Coach of the Year, Fort Worth Star-Telegram Coach of the Year, SETCA Coach of the Year, Texas High School 5A/6A Coach of the Year, and

WBCA Pat Summit National High School Coach of the Year. She has also been named District Coach of the Year 18 times.

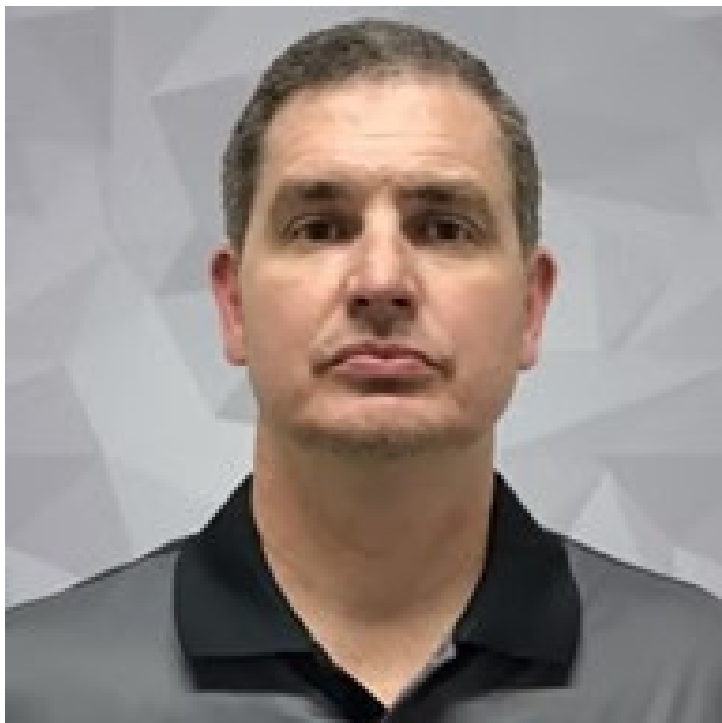
She has served the coaching profession through her service on the Texas Girl's Coaches Association Board of Directors for eight years and the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches Board of Directors for four years. In recognition of her career and impact, on and off the court, she was inducted into the Carthage HS Athletics Hall of Honor in 2021 and the Carthage ISD Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame in 2023.

Throughout her career, she and her teams have been involved in many community service activities, including building pet houses for a no-kill animal sanctuary, volunteering annually at Back-to-School Bash events for elementary students, organizing Thanksgiving turkey and canned food drives, participating in elementary school walk-ins prior to games, and helping with 5K races benefitting special needs children.

Coach Martin believes her greatest satisfaction comes from watching young women grow through the game of basketball develop confidence and leadership qualities, and carry those lessons into their lives beyond high school. She strongly believes in the quote by John Wooden, *"Success is peace of mind attained only through self-satisfaction in knowing you made the effort to do the best of which you are capable"*. That philosophy has guided her work with student-athletes, schools, and communities throughout her career.

John Wooden Legacy Award 2025-26

Tommy Brakel



Tommy Brakel is in his 28th year as the head boys' basketball coach at North Crowley High School and his 32nd year in education. Coach Brakel has compiled a 815-163 won-loss record during that span. His teams have qualified for the State playoffs 27 of his 28 years as the head coach at North Crowley. His teams have won 22 District Championships, advanced to 12 Regional Tournaments, and captured State Championships in 2008 and 2026.

Coach Brakel was a 2-time All-American at Sul Ross University, where he was later inducted into their Hall of Honor. He has received numerous honors throughout his career including being named the THSCA Coach of the Year in 2008, coached Team USA in the Nike Global Games, UIL Sponsor Excellence Award, District Coach of the Year, 15 times, selected a Top 100 Coach in UIL history, coached the McDonald's All-American Game, coached the TABC All-Star Game, among other honors not listed.

Coach Brakel and his teams have served the Crowley/North Crowley area throughout his career. He and his players have spoken often at elementary and middle schools about the importance of education and athletics, volunteered as coaches, officials, and organizers at youth leagues, and helped to raise money for the Cook's Children's Medical Center's Stuffed Teddy Bear Drive that was organized by his daughter who was a high school senior at the time.

Coach Brakel stated that he has read every book by Coach Wooden, or about him. *"There has been no person in my life that has been indirectly more impactful than John Wooden."* – Coach Tommy Brakel
